The opening reception is in Dadian Gallery in the Henry Luce III Center for Arts and Religion on Thursday, October 3, 2024 from 6-8pm. *Accumulate* invites viewers into a transformative space where art, community, and personal experience converge. The event is free and open to the public.

Houff, a Virginia native and raised in the Shenandoah Valley, brings her rich background in papermaking, book arts, printmaking, and installation to this exhibit. She holds a Master of Fine Arts in Community Art from the Maryland Institute College of Art (MICA) in Baltimore and currently serves as Adjunct Faculty and Communications Manager at Wesley Theological Seminary. Accumulate is not just an art installation; it is an experience that invites participants to reflect on their life journeys and contribute to a collective narrative. The piece explores profound questions about how our experiences shape us, how connections help us thrive, and how we navigate the dualities of resilience and heartache. Visitors are encouraged to add their own pages to the installation, offering a piece of their own story to the communal narrative. Houff hopes that every participant will find something meaningful in the experience.
